appears in his proper person and says that he can not garnisay, but that he has of the lights and credits of the said Richard Bollney, One Steer of two years and halfe Old (which is valued by the Court to twenty - Shillings curr. money) Three Gallons of Molafor (of the value of five shillings currant Money) One fish gizz and Butter pott (of the value of two shillings currant Money) which said Steer, three gallons of Molafor, fish gizz and Butter pott, according to the valuation aforesaid amounts to twenty seven - Shillings curr. money. Likewise the said George Howard garnisay of the aforesaid Richard Bollney appears in his proper person and says that he can not garnisay but that he has of the lights and credits of the aforesaid Richard Bollney to ten shillings currant money - nor can they say but that the same ought to be condemned in their hands for the use of the said John Collings as of the lights and credits of the said Richard Bollney which aforesaid Steer doth not garnisay &c.

Whereupon the aforesaid John Collings by his attorney aforesaid prays that upon giving security according to act of Assembly the aforesaid thirty one bushells and three pecks of Indian corn of the value of forty two shillings and four pence currant money so aforesaid Confeſſed by the aforesaid Thomas Bowden, One Steer, three Gallons of Molafor, fish gizz and Butter pott all of the value of twenty seven shillings currant money, and ten shillings currant money so aforesaid Confeſſed by the aforesaid George Howard as of the lights and credits of the aforesaid Richard Bollney may be condemned in the hands of the aforesaid Thomas Bowden, William West, and George Howard towards satisfying unto the said John Collings his damages and costs auncruing him.

Thereupon a certain John Smith of Somerset County Court present here in Court under habeas for the said John Collings according to act of Assembly that in case the said Richard Bollney do at any time within a year and a day appear and make all or any part of the said John Collings claim against him appear to be satisfied or otherwise to have been paid or before the laying of this attachment that then the said John Collings shall make confession unto the said Richard Bollney of all or such part thereof as shall be made appear to be undebt'd or that he desired John Smith will do it for him &c.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid sum of thirty one and bushells and three pecks of Indian corn of the value of forty two shillings and four pence currant money of Maryland so aforesaid Confeſſed be condemned in the hands of the said Thomas Bowden as of the lights and credits of the aforesaid Richard Bollney toward satisfying unto the said John Collings his damages and costs aforesaid and all auncruing upon him within of attachment and that the said John Collings have thred of Recencion &c.

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Steer of two years and halfe Old, three Gallons of Molafor, One fish gizz, and Butter pott, all of the value of twenty seven shillings currant Money of Maryland so aforesaid Confeſſed be condemned in the hands of the aforesaid West as of the lights and credits of the aforesaid Richard Bollney toward satisfying unto the said John Collings his damages and costs aforesaid and all auncruing upon him within of attachment and that the said John Collings have thred of Recencion &c.
