to comply with the Covenants and Conditions

Thereupon the aforesaid John Colbourn present before the Court in his  
proper person acknowledged himself to owe and stand duly indebted unto the aforesaid George Norton  
in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling of his goods and Chattels Lands or Tenements for the use of the said  
George Norton his heirs or assigns to be made and Levied if default be made in the Conditions hereunder  
written --

The Condition of the above Recognizance is Such that if the above bounden  
John Colbourn do and Shalt during the Servitude of the aforesaid George Norton Learn him to read  
well in the Letter and at the Signation of his Servitude Give him anew Suit of apparell Over and  
above his Common Wearing apparell, and Likewise find and provide for his said apprentice Sufficient  
meat drink washing Lodging and apparell meet for such a Servant to have and wear during his Servitude  
aforesaid then the above Recognizance to be void otherwise --
