Whereupon it is ordered by the Court that the aforesaid John Colbourn Give Recouerance in ten pounds sterl. for to comply with the Covenants abovesaid Thereupon the aforesaid John Colbourn present herin Court in his proper person & acknowledged himself to owe and stand durtly indebted unto the sd George Norton in the sum of Ten pounds Sterling of his goods and Chattells Land or tenements for the use of the said George Norton his heirs or assigns to be made and levied if defaill be made in the judgment hereunder

Written - The condition of the above Recouerance is such that if the above bounden John Colbourn do and shall during the Servitude of the aforesaid George Norton bear him to read well in the latter and at the Expiracion of his Servitude give him a suit of apparel Over and above his common Wearing apparel and likewise find and provide for his said Apparell sufficient meat drink washing Lodging and apparel mete for such a servant to have and wear during his Servitude aforesaid then the above Recouerance to be void other wise &c
