Walter Doreminger Brings into Court his Servant Woman named Jane Andrew and prays that the said Jane Andrew may be adjudged to serve him for five days Runaway time during her Servitude with him, and Likewise prays that he may be adjudged to serve him for two hundred pounds of tobacco paid for taking up of the said Jane Andrew when Runaway as aforesaid. Whereupon the said Jane Andrew is adjudged by the Court here to serve the said Walter Doreminger his Master or assigner two days for every day she was Runaway as aforesaid, which amounts in the whole to ten days, Likewise the said Jane Andrew is adjudged by the Court to serve the said Walter Doreminger for the aforesaid two hundred pounds of tobacco paid as aforesaid when Runaway three months, which said ten days and three months service are adjudged by the Court to commence at the Expiration of her already Indated or Contracted Servitude.

Hugh Stevenson } To the Worshipfull the Justices of Somerset County now in Court sitting the petition of Hugh Stevenson Most Humbly Presenteth that your petitioner is possessed of two tracts of Land the name of the one Ennalls enlarged the other apart of a tract called Mulberry Conveyency called and known by the Name of Cattle Quarter the bounds of which are somewhat decayed Therefore your petitioner humbly prays your worship will be pleased to appoint Court to examine evidence in relation to the bounds thereof and he as in duty bound shall pray Hugh Stevenson

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation thereupon had. Wherefore it is considered by the Court that a Commission issue unto the aforesaid Hugh Stevenson as by the petition aforesaid is prayed and that James Martin, Edmund Hough, John Scarbrough and Mathew Hopkins of Somerset County Gent be Commissioners and execute the same Commission according to act of assembly in such case made and provided be.

Ordered that the new road lately opened by John Tule of dividing Greaty according to former order of Court by his plantation be and remain as County road for the future.

Henry Ballard } Henry Ballard of Somerset County Gentleman is appointed by the Court as Guardian to : an infant Richard Magraw an Orphan under the age of fourteen years, and it Richard Magraw. is ordered by the same Court that the aforesaid Henry Ballard take into his care and custody all the Estate of the said Richard Magraw both Real and personal, and Likewise the said Henry Ballard is further ordered to give Security for to comply with the Law in relation to the guardianship aforesaid. Thereupon the said Henry Ballard with Robert King of Somerset County Gent his Security both present his aforesaid Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe &
