At which said next Court to wit the Twentieth day of March and Dow One thousand Seven hundred and thirty two came againe as well the ¹² John Tunstall as the aforesaid Patrick Connally by their attorney aforesaid and thereupon his Lordships His Right Honble the Lord Proprietary his certaine Writt of Habeas Corpus unto the Justices of his County Court of Somerset aforesaid Sendeck whiche said Writt followeth in these words videlicet Maryland for Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To the Justices and Sheriff of Somerset County greeting Whereas certaine Patrick Connally of the same County is detaine in the Prison of our said County under the custody of our said Sheriff at the Suit of certaine John Tunstall assignee of Hugh Barker in a pleas of debt which said pleas as it is said still depend before you our said Justices undetermined and we being willing for divers causes that the pleas aforesaid should be heard and determined before the Justices of our Prov. Court therefore we command you that you have the body of the said Patrick Connally by whatsoever name he be called in the pleas &c together with the day and cause of his caption and detainer and all things therunto Relating before the Justices of our Provinciall Court to be held at Annapolis the third hundayday of May next that our Justices of our Provinciall Court may further proceed therin as to Justice appertaining thereto of face not at your service and have you there ^{and} therethen with witness Lewis Gale Esq; Chief Justice of our Prov. Court the twenty fourth day of Octo: in the eighteenth year of our dominion &c annoq; Dow. One thousand Seven hundred and thirty two &c
