Underwood Benchor } To the Worshipful Justices of Somerset County Court the humble petition of

Hark neck whose bounders are Old and decayed and the Evidence aged your petitioner prayeth
the Court would appoint Commissioners in Order to examine Evidence in Relation thereto and as in duty
bound shall pray. The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood.

Wherefore it is Considered by the Court here that a Commission Issue unto the aforesaid Under-
wood Benchor as by the petition aforesaid is prayd and that John Scott, William Lane, Robert
Jenkins Henry and Thomas Hayward all of Somerset County Gent. be Commissioners and execute
the same Commission according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c. —

Frances Wilson } To the Worshipful Justices of Somerset County in Court now sitting the petition of Fran-
petⁿ ... } Wilson humbly Sheweth

That Whereas your petitioner hath negro Women that
is very Old and past Labour and doth not Earn the Virtues she labo and Coats she wears
your petitioner therefore prays your worships to set her tax free and your petitioner as in duty
bound shall ever pray. Frances Wilson. —

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and mature Deliberation there-
upon had. Wherefore it is Considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid Francis Wilson
be for the future discharged from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid Negro Women as by the petition
aforesaid is prayd &c. —

Phenix Hall came now into Court, and prays that for as much as he hath negro man named
Jack that is very Old and decay, and not able to Labour, that he may be discharged from paying
of Taxes for the future &c. Whereupon it is Considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid
Phenix Hall be discharged for the future from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid Negro Jack
as aforesaid is prayd &c. —

William Throughton of Somerset County Gents: came now into Court and prays that he may be
discharged for the future, for paying of Taxes for his Negro Man alley who is very Old and decay
and past Labour. &c. Whereupon it is Considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid Wm Thoug-
hton be discharged for the future from paying of Taxes for the aforesaid Negro Man named alley
as aforesaid is prayd &c. —
