

Hunger taken away and your petitioners plantation Left as Common I humbly pray your worship to grant me Liberty to turn the said Road where it will be less damage to your petitioner and helter for the Inhabitants and as good away and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray &c.

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation there upon had

Wherefore it is Considered by the Justices here that the said Southey Whittington turn the Road as by the petition aforesaid is praid, and that the Old Road be Left Open for tressellers while the new Road be made as near, and good, and passable, as the Old, and further it is ordered by the Court that the said Southey Whittington be Overseer of the said Road from Nausongo bridge to Lodoinks Savanough &c.

Ordered by the Court that Moses Durkey be Overseer of the Road from Lodoinks Savanough to the long bridge at the head of Owinkanomoco River &c.

Ordered by the Court that William Givans, George Givans, and Jane Givans daughters of James Givans late of Somerset County Esq. remain in and under the care of Benjamin Benable, until June Court next &c.

That your petitioner is posset with a tract of Land lying in Newadox neck through which the County Road Runnes and your petition having present occasion to make use of the same ground, praye your worship will be pleased to allow your petitioner to move the same road only about twelve yard off either and your petitioner will willingly make the new road quite as good as the old one and your petitioner as in duty bound will Ever pray &c.

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation there upon had Wherefore it is Considered by the Justices here that the said John Townsend turn the Road as by the petition aforesaid is praid so first marking the new Road as good and passable as the old &c.

Whereupon the Court here by the present aforesaid bound Charles Pade the younger son of the aforesaid Charles Pade unto the aforesaid Robert Watson while he arrives at the age of twenty One years he being two year old last November the said Charles Pade the younger to serve his said Master his hair or a sinner the full term aforesaid, during which term the said Charles Pade the younger, his said Master well and faithfully shall serve, his Servants keeps, his Commandments lawfully and honestly Every where he livingly shall do, and in all things as good and faithful Servant shall demean himself towards his said Master and all him during the term aforesaid In Consideration of which service the said Robert Watson Covenanteth with the Justices of the same Court, in Court judicially Sitting on behalfe of the said Charles Pade the younger, that he the said Robt. Watson during the term aforesaid, will learn his said apprenticeship
