

Like wise to the following Commission, was Annexed the following Depositions &c.

The Deposition of Richard Chambers aged forty four years or there abouts Who saith that A Red oak Standing on the East side of Awamp that Makes out of A Savana which he shewed to us was the first Bounder of a tract of Land Called High Meadow belonging now to Thomas Brereton and further saith not —

The Deposition of Miell Ragly aged twenty five Years or there abouts who saith that the Red oak above mentioned By Richard Chambers he hath heard Several of the Neighbours say that it was the first Bounder of Thomas Brereton's Land and further saith not —

The Deposition of Olive Chambers aged forty and Six Years or there abouts Who saith that she heard her father say Several times that the beginning or first Bounder of the Land that Sarah Hayman Lived on was in the Wood, Between Thomas Brereton's plantation and Sarah Hayman's and further saith Not —

The Deposition of Richard Chambers Aged forty four years or there abouts who saith that coming from Sarah Hayman's plantation with his father Richard Chambers his father shewed him on the Left hand of the path by the Savana and little branch that there was the Corner tree of the Land Called Hopewell that Sarah Hayman now Lived on being a Little Scruby White oak but that it was Dead and gone and further saith not —

The Deposition of Patrick Dailey Aged forty one Years or there abouts Who saith that Riding between Sarah Hayman's and Thomas Brereton's plantation that Richard Plunkett in Company with him, Shewed him a White oak Standing Between the two plantations and said that it was Thomas Brereton's tree or as he Under stood the Division Between ^{Brereton} and Hayman and further saith not —

The Deposition of Thomas Poole aged fifty five Years or there abouts who saith that Richard Plunkett told him that there was a White oak Standing Between Brereton's and Hayman's plantations that there was a tree Between the two plantations ^{that} was called Henry Hayman's tree and further saith that Joseph Standford Clearing a bitt of ground at the South ~~East~~ End of the plantation Richard Chambers Senr. told the said Joseph Standford to Clear for that he thought it was not his ground and further saith not —

The Deposition of Charles Hayman aged twenty Years or there abouts and this Deposition saith that Richard Plunkett told him that he saw a White oak Standing marked with Sixteen Notches and he thought to the best of his knowledge that it
