Somerset County. By virtue of a Commission to us directed from His Worship the Justices
of the County aforesaid to Edmund Withers in relation to the bounds of a tract of Land called Bartlett
have taken the following deposition viz —

The deposition of John Burnak a d. of Somerset County aforesaid Gent. aged Sixty
years or thereabouts being by us sworn upon the holy Evangelist of Almighty God deposeth and
saith that a dead Red Oak now in his sight standing by the Side of a small Savannah near the
head of Mattaponi Creek is one of the bounds of a tract of Land formerly Surveyed for Daniel
Selby alias Baubrey the bound of which was sometime since apertained by Commissioners appoin-
ted by act of Assembly and this deponent further saith that he verily believeth the aforesaid
tree to be the first bounder of the afo Land called Bartlett because the three first causes from
the afo tree are the same with the western bounds of the afo Land called Baubrey as will appear
by the deed of the afo Land called Bartlett and further saith not —

paying of taxes for the afo Negro woman called Moll as by the petition aforesaid is paid her
