 idle state of Health for this two year last past hath been wholly incapable of any service you  
 petitioner therefore humbly pray your worshipps to sett him Tax free and your petitioner shall as in duty  
 bound for ever pray . . . The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and mature  
 deliberation therupon had wherefore it is considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid John Waters be  
 discharged from paying of Levies for said Negro until he shall be capable of doing Service sufficient  
 for the paying of Taxes for him.

 to practice aforesaid is prayed her . . .

 from paying off Taxes for the aforesaid Negro woman called Bonner her . . .
