Whereupon he and John Dene late present lessee byt in his proper person acknowledged himself
to have and holden truly and well unto him and John both in the sum of yearly ground Rente money of Great Britain
to be paid off his goods and chattels, lands or tenements for the use of the said John byt his heirs or assigns, if default
be made in the payment hereunder written —

The condition of his Recognizance is such that if the above bounden John Dennis and his heirs, executors or administrators, do and shall care and truly clear the said John Dennis during his servitude up to and well in the time and to write and at the Expiration of his servitude give him alms, from suitable places, free gain apparel and apparel suit of clothes over his wearing apparel, and likewise find for his said apprentice sufficient meat drink washing lodging and apparelments for such an apprentice to have and wear during his servitude, then the above Recognizance to be void etc.
