Your petitioner therefore humbly prayeth your worshipps would be pleased to set free and for the said negroe from
paying his Taxes and your petitioner as a duty bound shall ever pray Wm. Simpson ---

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and matured deliberation had thereupon had . Wherefore
it is considered by the Justices that the aforesaid William Simpson be discharged for the future from paying taxes for the
aforesaid Negroe as by the petition aforesaid is granted him

Betw. --- } The humble petition of his subscriber Russell, that whereas your petitioner being a dweller on
Bank Creek and on Cummancey and being desired to convey Roads between the said Bank Creek and
Cummancey and from thence westward making it most convenient as also the majority of people that live between
the said Bank Creek and Cummancey, that Road should be cut out Road cleared and levellized down the Neck
between Hasted Back Creek and Cummancey the road not being above amiss broad therefore we pray that, that you
