day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirty two with force and arms in the County of Somerset agreed within the jurisdiction of this Court one pair of Boots of the Value of One pound ten shillings one pair of Gloves of the Value of three Shillings Current money of England of his goods and Chattels of certain Water fowl then and there feloniously stole took and carried away against the peace of the King — Hould the Lord Proprietary his good Rule and government and also against the form of the act of Assembly in that case made and provided —

On the back side of the foregoing Bill of Indictment it was thus endorsed vizt. Ignoramus —

Be it remembred that Edward Chambers Esq. Collector of the Customes

of the Land the King that now is in Doronoma District in the County and who as well for the said Lord the King the Right Honorable the Lord Proprietary of this Province as for himself followeth comes before the Justices of Somerset County in Court now sitting this nineteenth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand and seven hundred and thirty three in his proper person and as well for the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary as for himself giveth his Court here to understand and be informed that he the tenth day of June in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and thirty three A.D. at Somerset County and within the jurisdiction of this Court bound to the use of the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary and himself as forfeited the Vessel or Shallop called the Somerel whereof was then master Andrew Scott together with three hds of Tobago three Deer Skins and one Shillett for this after the Twenty ninth day of September which was in the Year of our Lord Sixteen hundred and Seventy One to wit the said tenth day of June in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred and thirty three aforesaid in Somerset County and Three Hogsheads of Tobacco of the growth of the Province of Maryland were laden and taken on board the said Vessel or Shallop without any bond being given that the said Tobacco should be carried to Great Britain or some other of the Majesties British Plantations contrary to the form of the Statute in such cases provided whereupon the said Edward Chambers Esq. as well for the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary as for himself prayeth the advice of the Court herein the premises and that the said Vessel or Shallop together with her Tacke apparel and furniture and the said three Hogsheads of Tobacco three Deer Skins & one Shillett remain forfeited to the use of the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary and the said Edward Chambers Esq.; and that he the said Edward Chambers Esq. may have One hundred pounds of the value thereof according to the form of the Statute — and

Upon which proclamation for the Lord the King (as the manner is) was made if any person would inform the Court how why the said ^{Vessel} Shallop together with her Tacke apparel and furniture, three Hogsheads of Tobacco, three Deer Skins and One Shillett to the said Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary
