The petition aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation thereupon had where <sup>fore</sup> it was considered by the Justices here that a Commission of five to the aforesaid William Doorman as by the petition aforesaid is provided and that Thomas Dashiell, James Munroe, William McCamey and Robert Jones all of Somerset County Gentlemen be Commissioners and execute the same Commission according to Law & c & c
