The condition of the above Recognition is such that if the above bounden John Riggyn do and shall make his personall appearance before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Commonall to be held at Dwidning Green the third Tuesday of June next, to answer unto his Lordship concerning such matters and things as shall be then and there objected against him on his Lordships behalfe, and to stand and abide the judgment of the said Horroway, and do not depart the Court with License therof and in the mean time to be of the good behaviour to all his Lordships Good people and more especially toward the said Samuel Riggyn then the above Recognition to be void and of none Effect otherwise.
