whereupon the said Edward Evans with William Walton his Security both present before me in their proper persons present before me acknowledged themselves to owe and stand justly indebted unto the said Lawrence Evans in the sum of forty pounds Sterling good and lawfull money, of their goods and chattels lands and tenements for the the use of the said Lawrence Evans his heirs and assigns justly and severally to be made and levied if default be made in the condition hereunder written

The Condition of the above Recouerance is such that if the above bounden Edward Evans do and shall well and faithfully educate and bring up, or cause to be educated and brought up his said apprentices during the term aforesaid in the trade of a glazier and Reed and will well and at the expiracion of his servitude give him a set of glass making tools, a young mare of two years old and an ewe lamb of the year and above his common wearing clothes and likewise feed and provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Clothing, more for such an apprentice to have and wear during his servitude to have endearne, then the above Recouerance to be void and of none effect otherwise so —

The petition aforesaid being read and heard and all and singular as well on the part of the petitioner as on the part of the aforesaid Mary Fountain as also upon several allegations &c Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the aforesaid Sirice <sup>be</sup> discharged from under the care and tuition of the aforesaid Mary Fountain as by his petition aforesaid is provided —

Upon the motion of Michael Carr to be tax free & its having been vidded by the Court that the said Michael Carr be tax free for the future &c —
