pett<sup>t</sup> against } To the Worthy & his Lordships Justice of Somerset County now sitting the humble petition  
John Turpin -- of Mary Records most humbly sheweth —

That your petitioner having served John Turpin these four years past (in which time has been used in almost Barbarous manner) your petitioner humbly conceiveth that she is free from her servitude altho' she is now detained contrary to all reason beds<sup>not</sup> and allows her negro to beat me and strip me and with switches the said Negro did whip in almost Shamefull manner as Capt Scott hath been an eye witness, having seen the blows and strips therefore humbly begs your wrights will be pleased to clear me off so barbarous master and mischeif and off so unjust Servitude and your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray &c — Mary Records.

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court here that the Sher. of Somerset County summon the said John Turpin to stand be and appear immediately before the Justices of his Lordship's County Court of Somerset now sitting at Bridgwater to answer the petition aforesaid. Whereupon afterward, came he into Court as well the aforesaid petitioner as the aforesaid John Turpin in their proper persons, and the petition aforesaid being read and heard, as also the severall allegations as well on the part of the petitioner as on the part of the said John Turpin being fully weighed and understood and mature deliberation whereupon had as also the severall Judgments of Court for Runaway time, the said Mary Records <sup>was</sup> condemned to serve two severall masters being das ported &c —

Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Mary Records from the service of the aforesaid John Turpin be acquitt and set her off without day &c and further it is considered by the Justices here that the aforesaid Mary Records recover against the aforesaid John Turpin one hundred and eighty six pounds of tobacco for her costs and charges to the same Mary by the Court here adjudged &c —

His Lordship's Somerset County Esq. Be it remembred that Lewis Gale Esq. prosector of his Lordship's pleas and Clerk of Judiciums in the same County Court comes into Court before the Worthy & Samuel Hopkins Jno. Turpin Esq. and his associates Justices of the same Court this fifteenth day of June in the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred and thirty one and gave the same Court to understand and be informed that John Turpin late of Somerset County planter the tenth day of April in the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred and thirty one at Somerset County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court with force and arms in and upon a certain Mary Records (the same Mary known and ther being a servant to the said John Turpin) in the peace of God and the said Lord proprie- tary knew and ther being an assault did make and her the said Mary knew and ther did beat wound and evilly entreat her and ther giving to her the said Mary more than ten lashes for one offence so that after life it was much despaired and other harmes ther and ther did to the great damage of the said Mary and against the peace of the said Lord proprie- tary his good rule and Government and contrary to the form of the act of assembly in that case made and provided wherefore the same Lewis pray the advice of the Court in the premises and due process against him to do — Lewis Gale Esq. Lord Proprietary.

Whereupon Command was given to the Sher. of Somerset County that he should take the said John Turpin if he to answer &c and afterwards in the same Court gave the said John Turpin and being by the Sher. set to the bar is therupon instantly demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises, aforesaid above upon him imposed, submit with a protestation of his innocency because he will not content with his said Lordship the Lord proprie- tary and putt him selfe upon the favour of the Court &c whereupon aye and singular the gramester by the Court here being seen heard & fully understood — It is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid John Turpin pay to his said Lordship the said Lord Proprietary one hundred pounds of tobacco for his fine by reason of the premises, aforesaid above upon him imposed and that the said John Turpin be taken to satisfy his said Lordship of the fine aforesaid &c —
