that runs up to Hezek. Nutters house and ten yards to the East end of a marked Stand oak -  
and ten yards to w<sup>e</sup> West end of another small gully from which said place Wm<sup>e</sup> -  
Gillis, Th<sup>r</sup> More, Richard Riddor, Jam<sup>s</sup> Weatherly, Benj<sup>o</sup> Wallis and James Mashmore  
declared to be the boundary of Garskemain or the good acres as appears by their  
depositions hereunto annexed -

Maryland Somersel county Octob<sup>r</sup> the 24<sup>th</sup> 1726 Wm Gillis aged fifty six years -  
swore on the holy Evangelist of Almighly God Standing att the place saying he  
was shew<sup>d</sup> by the old standers a tree that they reported to be the first Bounder  
of said Land, and that he knew it when it was a green Standing tree where -  
now the post stands his father W<sup>m</sup> Healey and Jenkinne Morris showed him  
said tree the same day came John More aged Seventy three Sworn saith that  
about twenty years agoe that Robert Doun, John Kemp, and Col<sup>d</sup> Whitten<sup>t</sup> told him that the place the above Gillis swore to was the first bounder of -  
Garskemain The same day came Richard Riddor aged forty eight years -  
swore with that Matthew Nutt<sup>r</sup> and W<sup>m</sup> Gillis brought him and Jonathan  
Jackson, and Thom<sup>s</sup> Ralph and showed him the same place that W<sup>m</sup> Gillis  
swore too and that there was a green Standing tree there about fourteen -  
years agoe. The same day came James Weatherly aged fourty two Sworn -  
with that about twenty one years agoe that In<sup>d</sup> Kemp got him to carry the  
chain from the Westermost side of a small gully about the place that W<sup>m</sup>  
Gillis swore too -

The same day came James Mashmore aged fifty two or therby sworn saith  
that about twenty years agoe what Capt<sup>t</sup> James Dashiel Capt<sup>t</sup> Nicholas -  
Evans Mr<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Johns he was chosen to Devide and Share the Mease Called -  
Nutt<sup>r</sup> Neck between Christopher and Matthew Nutt<sup>r</sup> the said Christopher  
and Matthew brought him to this place to the Best of his Remembrance -  
being a branch near the marsh side not far from Matthew Nutt<sup>r</sup>s dwelling  
house and told him that here was a bounder of childe and that there Land -  
extended and went no furder up Quantico Creek and further with not -  
The same day came Benj<sup>o</sup> Wallis aged forty Seven or therby sworn saith that  
he has sumoned upon Gary about twenty one years agoe upon the said -

Land by John Kemp and said In<sup>d</sup> Kemp and Matthew Nutt<sup>r</sup> brought us -  
I think to the best of my knowledge to this place and said here is the first  
Bounder viz the place that W<sup>m</sup> Gillis swore too but finding the aliation  
so defaced we could not find the courses whiche stopped our further proceeding  
some time after being in company with Col<sup>d</sup> Evans upon the Road by -  
Hamiltons Plantation Evans being then Hamiltons Attorney Evans told me  
that this Land might be bought and that an Ingenuous man might make  
a good In trust here for there was 200 acres of Land clear between the Line  
and the Creek and further with not - aged forty nine years or there abouts

I Chas. Nutt<sup>r</sup> doe heartily give my reason to the best of my Remembrance -  
that about five or six years agoe we went up Quantico Creek near the upper end of  
John Hambleys plantation so called by the Road side there mark<sup>t</sup> and oak  
by the side of an old fallen tree I being in company with severall people -  
viz Geo<sup>r</sup> Dashwell Thomas Dashiel Mitchell Dashiel John Nicholson -  
Christopher Piper Robert Jones and Christopher Dashiel and others I had  
then another that I was in company with my father in former years -  
when I was very young going up & down Quantico along a path I had some  
thoughts he told me a red oak whether it was marsh or no I do not know  
Best of my thoughts he told me it was a corner tree of Stevens or Evans Land  
(whether)
