

June Court — 1721 — 89

At Israhel Bredale — Somerset County vs. James Rownd late of Somerset County Gent executor of the Last Will and testament of Robert Ogleby dec'd was attelked to answer unto Israhel Bredale of Apole of his p[ro]p[erty] upon the Coram [sic] And whereupon the said Israhel by Francis Allen his attorney Complaineth that whereas the said Robert in his Lifetime vid the Second day of March and Dated One thousand Seven hundred and twenty eight at Somerset County as within the Jurisdiction of this Court was by the Providence of God affilcted with Sickness at the house of him the said Israhel in Consideration that he the said Israhel at the Special instance and request of the said Daniel Robert then and therewould provide for and nurse the said Robert in the time of his Sickness, and in case the said Robert Should depart this Life at the house of him the said Israhel he the said Israhel would Bury him the said Robert in a Christian decent manner his said Robert then and here in his life to witt the day and year aforesaid at the day and year next at the place aforesaid upon himself did assure and to the said Israhel then and therewill faithfully promise that he the said Israhel so much as he the said Israhel shoud reasonably deserve for the nursing of him the said Robert in the time of his Sickness and for all reasonable damages and expences about his same as also for the funerall charges and expences in and about the burying of him the said Robert in case of death of him the said Robert Out of the estate of him the said Robert after the decease of him the said Robert Should be truly and honestly contented satisfied and paid and the said Israhel in fact saith that giving credit to the promise and assumption of the said Robert in his Lifetime so as aforesaid he the said Israhel and family dwelle and Diligently attend the said Robert in the time of his Sickness and also did after the decease of the said Robert bury the said Robert in a Christian decent manner and that he for the attendance nursing and trouble of his house and family and the Paying of him by the said Robert and for the funerall charges and expences in burying the said Robert doth Reasonably deserve to have and receive of the said James Esq. of the said Robert the sum of four pounds Eleven Shillings and two pence Current money of Maryland of which the said James Rownd the Thirteenth day of March and Dated Seventeen hundred and twenty nine hundred and six by the hands of the said Israhel had note bid at the County as within the Jurisdiction as notwithstanding the said James the promise and assumption of the aforesaid Robert in his Lifetime so as aforesaid nothing regarding but plotting and fraudulently intending the said Israhel in that part craftily and subtley to deceive and defraud the aforesaid four pounds Eleven Shillings and two pence Out of the Estate of the said dec'd altho he came to do the said James by the said Israhel on the aforesaid Thirteenth day of March in the Year last mentioned and often afterwards at the County as he was then and there requested hath not paid or in any sort for the same contented hath refused and still doth refuse and deny wherupon the said Israhel saith he is ware and hath damage to the value of nine pounds current money of Maryland and wherupon he bringg suit geo.
