The depositions taken by us the subscribers the 7th day of August 1790 in relation to the boundaries of
a tract of Land called Elliott's (now belonging to Edward Roberts) by virtue of a sum mentioned to be directed for so.

Doring — Mr. Ephraim Wilson aged about Sixty four years being witness to the Holy Evangelist affirme
God deponent and saith that he was a Commissioner on behalf of said Captell Elliott gone in the possession of Edward
Roberts, and that James Gold was then sworn as an Evidence in Relation to the boundaries of the aforesaid land
afforementioned called Elliott gone, declared that Francis Roberts Employed him to mark some logs and that he did
place some posts for the same purpose by the Marsh side about two hundred and fifty yards south or there abouts
from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts, and some time after Francis Roberts came to James Gold and
said Gold that he had fallen a boundary of Elliott gone and the said Gold asked him if it was the first boundary
and the said Gold said it was, Patrick Quatermaine declared much the same on his oath, and several other
Evidence, much to the same purpose, that a pine stump which is deponent now stands by near the marsh
side and about two hundred and fifty yards south or there abouts from the house of Edward Roberts
aforesaid was the first boundary of Elliott gone, and that the other Commissioner that was present with
deponent which was Maj' Charles Walland Capt John Tunstall and Mr John Colwell allowed
the said pine stump to be the first boundary of Elliott gone and that no other boundary appeared to them
and further dealeth not — — — — —

sides with four Nolches on a side at a greate stony standyng near amarsh side about two hundred and fifty yards
from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said House and further sayeth not His Lassey.
