

Therefore require you or any three or two of you at some time and place to you or any three or two of you shall seem convenient you meet on the aforesaid Land Called Elliotts Grove (you first having taken your Oath on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God according to act of assembly in such case made and provided) and there (give to come before you or any three or two of you all such Evidences as shall be to you or any three or two of you nominated by the said Complainant (or defendant if any) and that you examine them upon their Ograte Oath to be by you or any three or two of you Administered on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God in the presence of the Complainant (or defendant if any) touching the truth or remembrance of their knowledge or any thing that may relate to the Cause aforesaid and that reducing the severall depositions into writing you send the same together with this our Commission under your or any three or two, of your hands to us to our County Court of Somerset with all convenient speed Witness Willelm Blakner Gent. One of our Justices of our said Court the seventeenth day of June in sixteenth Year of our Dominion Br. Anno Dom. One thousand seven hundred and Ninety

On the back side of the foregoing Commission it was thus Endorsed and to the same Commission there was annexed as followeth vid. — There are to Certifie that this 6. of August anny. Dom. 1790 James Thomas Gilly Henry Ballard and Lewis Rigby three of the within Commissioners before me the Subj. in one of the said Proprietarys Justices of the peace for the County of Somerset and took their Oath on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God to execute the within Commission duly and impartially and examine and Certifie all such Evidences as shall be produced to them in and concerning the bounds of the within mentioned tract of Land Called Elliotts Grove according to the form of the act of assembly for the ease of the Inhabitants in Examining Evidences relating to the bounds of Land and in the manner of Obtaining Injunctions sworn to the day and Year aforesaid

The depositions taken by us the subscribers the 7. day of August 1790 in Relation to the bounds of a tract of Land Called Elliotts Grove belonging to Edward Roberts by Vertue of a Commission to us directed for so

Doing — Mr. Ephraim Willson aged about sixty four years being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God deposeth and saith that he was a Commissioner on a tract of Land Called Elliotts Grove in the possession of Edward Roberts, and that James Bolt was then sworn as an Evidence in Relation to the bounds of the aforesaid tract of Land Called Elliotts Grove, declared that Francis Roberts employ'd him to haul some logs and that he did fall some pieces for the same purpose by the Marsh side about two hundred and fifty yards south or thereabouts from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts, and some time after Francis Roberts came to James Bolt and told him that he had fallen a boulder of Elliotts Grove and the said Bolt asked him if it was the first boulder and the said Bolt said it was, Patrick Quatorius declared much the same on his Oath, and several other Evidences, declared much to the same purpose, that a quie stump which I deponent now stand by near the marsh side and about two hundred and fifty yards south or thereabouts from the house of Edward Roberts aforesaid was the first boulder of Elliotts Grove, and that the other Commissioners that was present with the deponent which was Mr. Charles Ballard Esq. John Sunstake and Mr. John Edwells allowed the said quie stump to be the first boulder of Elliotts Grove and that no other boulder appeared to them and further saith not

Mr. Thomas Laws aged forty one years or thereabouts being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God deposeth and saith that about twenty six years agoon that he saw Samuel Jones set up a post marked on four sides with four notches on sides at a quie stump standing near a marsh side about two hundred and fifty yards from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said house and further saith not this Laws.
