

Deposition of Willnesses taken upon the Land called North Benfitt in somerset Co<sup>ty</sup>  
on the Seabord side and on the South side of Sait. Martins River this Twentythird  
day of April one thousand Seven hundred and thirty one before us the Subscribers  
commissioners appointed by the Wards full the Justices of somerset County Court  
to examine Willnesses concerning the bounds of the afo Land as follows viz  
John Querton of somerset County Planter aged forty five years or there abouts  
being by us sworn upon the holy Evangelist of Almighty God deposeth and  
saith that about fifteen or sixteen years agoe he was in Company with  
Stephen Odear and Thom<sup>t</sup> Quillin and they shewed him a markt white Oak  
standing on the South west side of a Creek called Back Creek by the Water side  
between the mouth of Cutry branch and the old house Gal and that the afo  
Stephen Odear told him this Deponent that the afo White oak was the  
first bounder of Bonis Land called North Benfitt and that this <sup>his</sup> Stephen  
Corton shewed it to him and further saith Not

Jonas Smith aged thirly eight years or there abouts being by us sworn upon the holy Evangelist  
of almighty God deposeth and saith that about eleven or twelve years agoe he saw an Oak markt  
with sixteen notches standing by the side of the afo back Creek about the same place that John Querton  
saw to and that he took it to be the first bounder of North Benfitt and further saith not

Tho. Boden aged forty one year or there abouts being by us sworn upon the holy Evangelist  
of almighty God deposeth and saith that about thirteen or fourteen years agoe he saw a white Oak  
Oak that seemed to be marked for a marker tree that stood by the side of the afo Back Creek about  
the same place that John Querton has saw to and some time after he was telling Nathaniel Packlike  
of the afo tree and Packlike told him he thought it was the first bounder of North Benfitt for  
that stood there abouts and further saith not
