Hutton Hill Recover against the afo^d William Dulany his damages
and to one pound seventeen shillings currant money by the same W^m
in foward Confessed as also two hundred & forty five pounds⁰⁰
1729 Tobacco for his costs and charges afo^d to the same Hutton at his Request
by the Court here and consent of the parties afo^d adjudg'd^{wth} damages
in the whole do amount to one pound seventeen shillings and four

Whereupon the aforesaid William Dulany being called appears and thereupon the said William Dulany
at the pray of the afo^d Hutton Hill by his attorney is adjudged to give Special bail to the action aforesaid

Whereupon a certain John Evans Sen^r of Somerset County planter undertakes for the said William Dulany
that if he give the said Hutton Hill shall recover I judge in the place afo^d against the said William Dulany or that
the said William Dulany Should be herein found that then bid the said William Dulany shall pay the judgment
of the Court hereupon or lende his body to the custody of the Sheriff of Somerset County a Satisfaction
thereof or that he the said John Evans will do the same for him memorandum this bail price Should have been
entered before his confession but was omitted and entered less so -

This day to wit the 10 day of April in 1731 we the Subscribers being qualified and
bound to Law did enter into the Land of Captain Sarah Kight, together with Maj^r William Blaner and others
did view the plantation houses and out houses fenced and enclosed and find them as followeth viz
to one hundred and fifty nine paces of old fence; bound forty seven apple trees
to two hundred and seventy eight paces of very old fence bound forty seven apple trees -
to one old dwelling house 25 foot long - to one old milk house 15 foot long, to one barn 40 foot long
to two hundred and fifty five paces of old fence bound a place called Little Bixie and ten apple trees within
the said fence given under our hands of day & year above
Do hereby certify the Subscribers Thomas Williams & Thomas Dixon were qualified
before we made of this Landings Justice of the peace in this County of Bedford according to law
