View of his Land.

Whereas we the Subscribers John Richards and John Tringle were nominated and appointed by One of his Lordship's Justices of the peace for this County of Somerset to view and inspect the Condition of a certain plantation Lying on ^{near} Cedar Creek on the Indian River being the supposed Right of Edward Clark son of Edward Clark Late of this County deceased whom upon the said view on the twenty fifth day of March in this present year 1730 did meet on the aforesaid plantation and after due inspection made we find the premises as follows, there is one dwelling Lodged house twenty foot in Length and fifteen foot in breadth tolerable Good as also one Lodged house fifteen foot in Length and twelve in breadth in danger of falling to the ground and as for Orchards we find but 20 apple trees and two peach trees on the said plantation and as for Inclosures about the Cultivated Land we find 300 panells of fence in good order as also Sixty panells of fence about pasture some what broken and as for flooring of Ground or cutting of timber we allow not more than what may be necessary for the plantation use and building and all these premises considered we cannot think the annual Value of the said plantation can be worth more than twenty Pounds per annum and this we Return as the Just and true estimate made and Inspected by us the aforesaid Viewers in presence of John Tule now Guardian to the aforesaid Edward Clark having first taken our Oath before John Smith the above named Justice of the peace Given under our hands & Seals this day and Year above written

Wherefore it is Considered by the Justices that the petition do be granted as prayed, and that Thomas Daskie, George Daskie, Thomas Brown and Robert Jones all of Somerset County Gent^l be Commissioners and execute the same Commission according to act of assembly in such case made and provided.

By Somerset County Court March 16th Day 1730
Ordered that John Cree, Robert Jones, Philip Covington and Thomas Laws all of Somerset County Gent^l lay out and settle a road through Edward Robert plantation at Sam Quaker Marsh for Richard Wallis and others the Inhabitants that hath occasion to make use of the said road
