Mr. Charles Williams aged Eighty years or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that he has been in company with Francis Roberts several times and that the said Roberts has pointed towards a large pine which stood by the marsh side near the place where the deponent now sits which is about two hundred and fifty yards from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said house and told him that that pine was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove and further saith not . . .

Margaret Williams aged sixty years or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that about nine years ago the said Commission was on a tract of Land called Elliotts Cove and that the deponent was present and John Roberts said that the pine stump which the deponent stands by was not the boulder of Elliotts Cove but that it was further down but Richard Wallis said that this is the boulder likewise said John White and my husband Charles White Williams and further saith not . . .

Owen Day aged about forty years being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that James Bolt told him that he sought to find a tree standing near a marsh about two hundred and fifty yards from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said house, and the deponent further saith that he heard James Bolt tell William Whittington that the stump of the tree which he found was the boulder of Elliotts Cove and that William Whittington runs from the said stump and further saith not . . .

Joseph Bolt aged forty one year or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that about twenty five years ago he was in a great orchard in company with one John Hillman and that the said Hillman told the deponent he would show him the boulder of Elliotts Cove as Samuel Jones told him and they went to a pine stump standing near <sup>the</sup> marsh side about two hundred and fifty yards from the dwelling house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said house the deponent further saith that the said Hillman told him that a boulder part standing by the said stump was put up by Samuel Jones, the said Jones told the said Hillman and that it was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove and that Samuel Jones took several young people and told them that the said boulder was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove the deponent saith that John Roberts interrupted James Bolt on his oath, and then Richard Wallis said standing by said that John Roberts was a liar for the said pine stump was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove likewise John White said said John Roberts was a rogue for the said pine stump as he said was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove and further saith not . . .

Priscilla Quakerman aged about thirty six years being sworn on the Holy Evangelist of almighty God deposed and saith that Samuel Jones came to his mother Ann Roberts and said I am come to settle the boulder of Elliotts Cove and that the said Jones went to a pine stump where the deponent now sits near the side of a marsh about two hundred and fifty yards from the <sup>dwelling</sup> house of Edward Roberts and about south from the said house with the deponent and several others and they set up a post at the foot of the said stump and that Samuel Jones told them that the said stump was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove and the deponent further saith that John White said said John White said he heard on the stump as he said and said it was the first boulder of Elliotts Cove and Richard Wallis said said Richard White so it is in the presence of a deponent who being there at the said stump and further saith not . . .
