

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The bill entitled, an act to repeal so much of the act to limit and define the jurisdiction of justices of the peace, passed at December session 1834, as relates to Baltimore county, which had been rejected by the Senate, was reconsidered and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Cecil county to levy a sum of money for building a bridge and erecting a dam in said county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Ricard, Wright and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, an act to allow Thomas Bruce, former sheriff of Prince George's county, further time to complete his collections,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Beckett and Brown.

A bill entitled, an act for building a Bridge over St. Joseph's Run in St. Mary's county,
