opening a road through a part of Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Kent, Bowie and Hilleary.

A bill entitled, as act relating to the election districts of Frederick county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Schley, Brown and Tidball.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel McBride,

to bring into this state a slave for a term of years,

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Hyland B. Pennington of Baltimore city, to bring into this state a slave for a term of years, and

A bill entitled, an act to authorise William B. Scott of St. Mary's county, to bring into this State certain negroes

therein named,

Which were severally read the first time and referred

to the committee on colored population.

Mr. Schley from the committee on the library to which was referred the resolution authorising the joint committee on the library to procure certain books from London, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Schley from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of negro Aaron of Frederick county,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to abolish the Board of Commissioners of Tax in Kent county and vest their powers and duties in the levy court of said county,

Which was read the first time.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten

MONDAY, February 6, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Brown submitted the following message,
