The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the Legislative Department of the Government of this State, and to repeal so much of the Constitution and Form of Government as may be inconsistent with its provisions, and

The bill entitled, an act relating to the Executive Department of the Government of this State, and to alter and abolish all such parts of the Constitution and Form of Government as may be inconsistent with its provisions, severally passed by the Senate on yesterday, were sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The bill entitled, an act to abolish the board of commissioners of tax in Kent county, and vest their powers and duties in the levy court of said county, was read the third time by special order and passed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of negro Aaron of Frederick county, was read the second time, and

The question put,

"Shall the bill be engrossed for a third reading?"

It was determined in the negative, so the bill was rejected.
