

WEDNESDAY, February 8, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution requesting the Governor to forward the report of the Treasurer of the Western Shore to the Executives of the several States and Territories, dissented from by the Senate on yesterday, was returned, and

The bill entitled, an act to abolish the board of commissioners of tax in Kent county, and vest their powers and duties in the levy court of said county, passed by the Senate on yesterday, was sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

February 6, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your amendment to our message in relation to the appointment of a register for Carroll county, proposing to make the appointment on the 9th instant. To this amendment we respectfully state we do not accede, and ask that the Senate may recede from their amendment.

Should the day proposed in your message be adopted, some of the candidates for the office in question, will not have a fair opportunity to place their claims before the Legislature for want of time. We know that some of the candidates are already apprised by letter from gentlemen of this house, of the day of election, believing that the day proposed in the original message would be adopted. Should the day be changed as proposed by your honorable body, the information furnished would be rendered unavailable to such candidate.
