Which were read and assented to:

In the 4th line 1st section, strike out the words "commonly called St. Joseph's Run," and insert "known as the head waters of St. Clement's Bay."

After the word "act" in the title of the bill, strike out the residue of the title and insert "to authorise the building of a bridge therein mentioned in St. Mary's county."
