And the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Citizens Bank of Baltimore, passed at December session 1835, chapter 314, were sever-

ally read the third time and passed.

The Senate proceeded to ballot for Bank Directors on the part of the State. The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein. It was sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Ricaud and Tidball, who had been appointed conjointly with a committee of the house of delegates to count the ballots and report the result. They retired, and after a time returned and reported that on examination of the ballot box they had ascertained there had been 82 votes given in all; of which, for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, Francis Neale had 64 votes and John W. Smith 64 votes; for the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer, junr. had 65 votes, Richard Swann 65 votes and Benjamin L. Gantt 70 votes; for the Branch of the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Easton, Thomas Hayward (of Dorghester) had 62 votes, William Hughlett 61 votes and James Price 59 votes; for the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann had 79 votes; and for the Hagerstown Bank, Alexander Neill, senr. had 61 votes and Daniel Weisal 61 votes, and there were 5 scattering votes and 2 blanks.
