Mr. Bowie from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel Jordon former collector of taxes in the sixth collection district of Baltimore county, now Carroll county, to complete his collections, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act relating to changing the venue for the trial of issues of fact framed in the Court of Chancery or any county court as courts of equity or orphans court of this state and sent to a county court for trial.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of

James Cochran, and

The resolution in favor of Sarah Jenkins, reported fa-

vorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house

of delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from the Adjutant General of the State, made in obedience to a resolution of the present session, shewing what officers have reported in conformity with the directions of the act of 1884, chapter 251,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of

the House of Delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to the proof of accounts of clerks of county courts and registers of wills, against their respective counties, reported favorably thereon.
