TUESDAY, February 14, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message received on the 6th inst, from His Excellency Governor Veazey, covering the report of the Commissioners of the Eastern Shore Rail Road, and two reports of the Chief Engineer of said Road, was sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs and devisees of Doctor Elijah J. Hall, late of Baltimore county, deceased, was re-committed to the committee on judicial proceedings.

On motion of Mr. Beckett,

The committee on finance was discharged from the consideration of the petition of the commissioners of the Farmers and Millers Bank of Washington county, and it was referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs and devisees of Doctor Elijah J. Hall, late of Baltimore county, deceased, reported that the committee had instructed him to ask leave to withdraw said bill and to report another in its stead.

The leave was accordingly granted, and Mr. Bowie then reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs and devisees of Doctor Elijah J. Hall, late of Baltimore county, deceased,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from the Treasurer of the Western Shore, made in obedience to resolution No. 77, of December session 1827,

Which was read, and with the inclosures, referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.
