

Mr. Jones from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to change the location of a part of Eutaw street in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes,

Which was read the first and by special order, the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled an act for the relief of Edward Hines, late of Kent county, was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the valuation of the real and personal property in Carroll county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to.

In the 1st section, 3d line, after the word, 'proceed' insert the words 'to appoint assessors.'

In the 3rd section 2nd line, after the word, 'to' strike out the word 'complete' and insert the word 'cause;' and after the word 'assessments,' in the same line, insert the words 'to be completed.'

In the same section and 8th line, strike out the word 'hereof.'

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.
