

the bill entitled, an act to appoint the commissioners of the tax for Carroll county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not pass, with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

In the 5th section 6th line, strike out from the word 'office,' to the word 'take' in the 12th line.

In the 7th section, after the word 'that,' insert the words, 'the said commissioners shall be entitled to receive two dollars, each, per day for every day they shall necessarily attend to the duties of their office, and twelve and a half cents for every mile they may have to travel to the place of meeting of the said commissioners; and'

Strike out the last section of the bill.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

12 o'clock having arrived, the Senate proceeded to the election of a register of wills for Carroll county. The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein. It was then sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Brown and Cottman, who were appointed by the Senate conjointly with a committee of the house of delegates to count the ballots and report the result. They retired, and after a time returned and reported, that on examination of the ballot box they found there had been 76 votes given in all, of which John Baumgartner, had 62 votes, scattering 7 votes, and there were 7 blanks.

Whereupon it was declared, that for Carroll county— John Baumgartner, is duly elected to be recommended to the Governor and Council, to be commissioned as register of wills for said county.

Mr. Bowie presented the memorial of James D. Woodside, for additional compensation for elevating to its summit the colossal statue of Washington,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.
