

"To locate and open a road in Allegany county, to commence on William's location at the most practicable point near to Lewis Davidson's, and to pass through the neighborhood of Walter Selby, and to intersect the turnpike road leading from Cumberland to Hancock at some point between Cumberland and the farm of Michael C. Sprigg.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said road shall not be located, opened, and cleared out more than sixteen feet wide, and not to pass through any yard, garden, orchard, meadow, or the lands of any person or persons without their consent.

Sec. 3d. And be it enacted, That the said Commissioners shall cause a plot and certificate of said road to be made out and returned to the Commissioners of Allegany county, so that the road be placed on the list of public roads in said county.

Sec. 4th. And be it enacted, That this act shall be null and void, unless the said road be located, opened, cleared out and made passable for wagons, at the cost and charges of the petitioners and others, so that Allegany county shall not have to pay any part thereof.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to alter, change and amend a certain road in Allegany county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

Sec. 1st. 2nd line, after the word "Smith," insert "Gustavus Beall and Joseph Dilley."

Sec. 4th, 1st line, after the word "said" insert "alterations, changes, and amendments in said road, shall not be made without the consent of the owner or owners of such land through which it is proposed to pass, and all to be made without any charge to Allegany county."

Strike out the residue of this section.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

The bill entitled, an act to regulate the right of voting by the stockholders, in the several incorporated institutions in this State, was taken up for consideration,
