TUESDAY, February 21, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yes-

terday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The preamble and resolutions in relation to the free expression of opinions and the transmission of them through the public mail; and the power of Congress to abolish slavery and the slave trade in the District of Columbia. assented to by the Senate on yesterday, were sent to the house of delegates.
