Mr. Cottman from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to limit the sessions of the General Assembly in every alternate year,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Kent from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act entitled, an act to authorize the appointment of commissioners and the division of Charles county into school districts, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Kent, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorize the laying out and opening a road through a part of Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

At the end of the first section add:

“Provided, that as far as the said road passes through Anne Arundel county, it shall be located upon the route heretofore surveyed and located by Henry Wayman, Charles D. Warfield and Edward Warfield, under a commission from Anne Arundel county court, and returned to said court in the month of April eighteen hundred and thirty.”

At the end of the 3d section add:

“Provided, that if any owner or owners of the land through which the said road shall pass, shall require the same, or if the said owner or owners be under age, or feme covert, the said commissioners shall apply to a justice of the peace of the county wherein the said lands lie, to summon a jury of at least twelve freeholders, to assess the damages done to the said lands—which jury shall be sworn, and return their inquest in the usual mode now required by law.”

Add at the end of the last section:

“Nor to Montgomery county, including as aforesaid, the sum of one hundred dollars.”
