On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Bowie, Tidball and Wright, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty five, chapter 339, entitled, an act for the relief of John Reynolds and others of Washington county.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution requesting the Governor to issue a commission in the usual form, to John Baumgartner, as Register of wills for Carroll county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Cottman.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from J. S. Shriver, President of the Baltimore and Reisters Town Turnpike Road Company, enclosing an abstract of the accounts of said company from the 6th January 1834, to the 2nd January 1837, in conformity to the directions of the act of Assembly, passed at November session 1804, entitled, an act to incorporate companies to make several Turnpike Roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth McCabe of Baltimore city, was taken up for consideration, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Jones, Tidball and Cottman, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act relating to the effect of the revocation of powers of attorney, by death or otherwise.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1835, chapter 339, entitled, an act for the relief of John Reynolds, and others, of Washington county,

Which was read the first time.
