Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

The bill entitled, an act to limit the sessions of the General Assembly in every alternate year, was committed to Messrs. Schley, Wright, Beckett, Brown and Hambleton.

Mr. Bowie from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, so far as the same relates to Kent county.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

The resolution authorising the Governor to issue a commission to the Hon. John S. Spence, was read the third time by special order, assented to and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Schley presentedr the petition of Achsal Cockey Ford of Baltimore county, counter to the memorial of Amos Boslev.

Which was read and referred to the committee on in-

ternal improvement.
