MONDAY, February 27, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

On motion of Mr. Hilleary,

The bill entitled, an act repealing part of an act passed at December session 1832, chapter 74, was recommitted to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The President pro tem. laid before the Senate the petition of Benedict Reynolds, for compensation as a soldier of the revolution.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of the Sheriff of Somerset county, for keeping prisoners in jail, and to provide for the maintenance of debtors actually confined in prison,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Cottman, Purnell and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act for the benefit of John S. Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Purnell, Cottman and Goldsborough.

Mr. Bowie from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act repealing part of an act passed at December session 1832, chapter 74, reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the 5th line of the bill, after the word "congregations," insert the words, "and also so much of said act as relates to the money collected and the application of the same."
