The following amendments were read and assented to.  
In the 6th line of the 8th section, after the word 'may,'  
insert the words 'and shall.'

At the end of the 8th section add:

"And the clerks of the several county courts in which  
any registries shall be made, or papers filed under the  
provisions of this act, shall be entitled to such sum or  
sums for recording and filing the same, as they are enti-  
tled to for other records."

The bill was then read through, passed and returned to  
the house of delegates.

Leave was granted to the committee on insolvency, to  
prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act for the re-  
lief of Thomas Goulden.

The message from His Excellency Governor Veazey,  
transmitting the report of George W. Hughes, Esquire,

Canal, received on the 23d inst, was sent to the house of  
delegates.
