### WEDNESDAY, March 1st, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The message proposing a final adjournment of the Legislature adopted by the Senate on yesterday, was reconsidered and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Wright from the committee on Judicial proceedings to which the order of the 27th of January last, was referred, reported a bill entitled an act supplemental to the act entitled, an act to establish Magistrates Courts, in the several counties of this State and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835, chapter 201, which was read the first time.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise John A. Pye and James B. Pye of Charles county, to bring into this State certain slaves therein named, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Beckett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation of wild fowl in the Potomac river, and its tributary streams, passed December session 1832, chap-
