It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Mahlon Talbot,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Finance.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1833, chapter 110,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wright, Goldborough and Beckett.

A bill entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government of the State of Maryland.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Schley, Wright, Beckett, Brown and Hambleton.

On motion of Mr. Wright,

The said committee was enlarged by adding thereto the name of Mr. Bowie.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Leave was granted to the said committee to set during the sittings of the Senate.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Rockville in Montgomery county, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise Fayettee street in Rockville in Montgomery county, to be closed and another to be called by the same name to be opened,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed and on motion of Mr. Bowie, read the third time by special order passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wright from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to the records of conveyances in the several counties of this state, passed at December session 1833, chapter 88,

Which was read the first time.

The resolutions to employ counsel to aid the Attorney General in prosecuting certain cases therein mentioned, were read the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.
