THURSDAY, March 2, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington county Savings institution, was read the second time, by special order and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Cottman presented the memorial of George Todd, Robert Dashiell, and others, praying that an act of Assembly therein mentioned, may not be repealed,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington county Savings institution, was read the third time, by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the form in which promissory notes may be given to the incorporated banks in this State, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore city, reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the inspection and weight of anthracite or hard coal, and for the measurement of bituminous coal.

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The bill entitled, an act relating to the effect of the revocation of powers of attorney by death or otherwise, was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Tidball from the committee to which was referred the petition of George Fouke and others, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of George Fouke and Elizabeth his wife, and Henry and Lewis Fouke,

Which was read the first time.
