

In the first section, fourth line, strike out 'forty-five,' and insert 'thirty.'

The bill was then read through, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Kent,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Kent, Jones and Tidball to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Savage village, in Anne Arundel county.

Mr. Brown presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel and Baltimore counties, praying that a bridge may be erected over the western branch of the Patapasco, at Marriottsville,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Kent and Jones.

Mr. Brown presented the petition of sundry citizens formerly of Baltimore but now of Carroll county, praying an alteration in the divisional lines of said counties,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones, Kent, Tidball and Cottman.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:
