

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Jones, Brown and Tidball.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Benjamin W. Bacon of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Prudence Bacon,

And a bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Richards of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Isaiah Richards,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

And returned the bill entitled, an act to prohibit the owners of vessels and others, from navigating the same by and under the sole command of negroes or mulattoes, endorsed, "amendment of the Senate further amended and adopted."

The said proposed amendment was read, and was as follows:

Strike out "county" and insert "counties."

Insert after "Anne Arundel" the words 'and Baltimore.'

Mr. Brown presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, for the passage of an act to abolish the board of county commissioners and to establish a Levy court in said county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Tidball.

Mr. Kent from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Henry C. Diury, of William, former collector of taxes, in the first collection district of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collections, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Mary Ford, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Valentine Brunner, and

The resolution in favor of Henry Baer, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration and were of opinion they ought not to be assented to.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.
