The Senate proceeded to the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill entitled, an act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of the State of Maryland, and the several amendments proposed thereto.

The question being on assenting to the amendment proposed by Mr. Kent, to the amendments as submitted by

Mr. Brown.

Mr. Jones moved to amend said amendment by striking out the words, "and the place for holding the sessions of the court of appeals for the western shore and the high court of chancery."

The question was put and determined in the negative.

The question was then put upon assenting to the amendment as proposed by Mr. Kent, and determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Tidball moved to amend said amendments by inserting after the words "Frederick county," in the 7th section, where they first occur, the words "five delegates in and for Washington county."

The question was put and determined in the negative. Mr. Hilleary moved to amend said amendments by striking out "five," after the word "city," in the 6th line of the 7th section.

The question was put and determined in the negative. Mr. Cottman moved to amend said amendments by in-

serting as the 4th section the following:

'And be it enacted, that one other Senator shall be elected generally from the Eastern Shore, who shall be elected by ballot of the Senators, as soon after their first meeting and qualification as conveniently may be."

The question was put and determined in the negative.
Mr. Tidball moved to amend said amendments by striking out after the words 'Frederick county, and' in the 7th section, where they occur, the word 'five' and inserting the word 'four.'

The yeas and nays were asked for and on taking them they appeared as follows:
