Which was read and referred to the committee on in-

ternal improvement.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud.

The bill entitled, an act to require the chancery court and the several county courts as courts of equity in this State, to demand bond with surety in cases of injunction, was taken up for consideration, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Tidball from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the Tax of Frederick county, to appoint an assessor to value certain property in Frederick county, reported fa-

vorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the resolution directing the clerk of Harford county court to deliver to William B. Stephenson, Esq. certain acts of Assembly, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.
