Mr Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to build a bridge over the Great Gunpowder Falls where the county road leading from Middletown to where the Falls road crosses said Falls in Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The title of said bill was amended by inserting after the word act,' the words 'to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county.'

The bill was then returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to repeal all that part of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Washington county into separate election districts and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on Divorces, to was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Eliza Anne Boyd of Kent county, from her husband James Boyd, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and dissented from:

Strike out where it occurs the words 'a vinculo matrimonii' and insert 'a mensa et thoro.'

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house

of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Henrietta Reid, from her husband William P. Reid, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to alter the Constitution and Form of Government of the State of Maryland, was taken up for consideration.
